



Daily Routine and Weekly Schedule


Recess and Snack Break

Adjusting School-based Assessment Structures

P1

> No examination, but weighted assessments are conducted throughout the year

P2

> Weighted assessments throughout the year and year-end exam

P3-6

> Mid-Year Exam (MYE) and End-of-Year Examination (EYE) in addition to weighted assessments throughout the year

Secondary level

> Most schools conduct MYE and EYE in addition to weighted assessments throughout the year

P1 & P2

> Removal of all weighted assessments (including P2 EYE)

S1

> Removal of MYE

From P3 to S4/5

> Schools to conduct no more than one weighted assessment per subject, per school term. This is in addition to MYE and EYE at levels where this is applicable

P3, P5, S3

> Removal of MYE

P4, P6, S2, S4/5

> Removal of MYE



Wild Africa Goes To School


- Simba the lion cub (our main character) needs help searching for his mommy.

2023 P1 Registration

- The registration of children for admission to Primary One (P1) in 2024 will open from Tuesday, 4 July 2023 to Tuesday, 31 October 2023.
- The dates for the different phases of registration can be found at: www.moe.gov.sg/primary/p1-registration/registration-phases-key-dates. The list of primary schools and vacancies available will be updated on the MOE P1 Registration website at www.moe.gov.sg/primary/p1-registration by mid-June 2023.

2023 P1 Registration

- From this year, parents can use the **new online registration portal** for all five phases of the exercise - Phases 1, 2A, 2B, 2C and 2C Supplementary - to register their child in their chosen school.
- The new portal replaces the online application form and the Primary 1 Internet System used in previous years.
- The P1 Registration Portal will go live on 4 July 2023 and can be accessed via the MOE P1 Registration website. Parents can log in to the Portal to view the phase(s) and school(s) their child is eligible to register in, as well as register their child in their chosen school when the phase the child is eligible for opens for registration.
- Parents will require a valid Singpass with 2-Factor Authentication (2FA) to login to the P1 Registration Portal. Parents are advised to set up their Singpass 2FA early and ensure that their Singpass account is valid before the commencement of the P1 Registration Exercise. Only one parent is required to login and submit the registration through the Portal.

P1 Registration Status

2022 P1 Registration for Admission to 2023 P1

- 210 places (7 P1 Classes)
- 103 places filled at Phase 1
- 47 places filled at Phase 2A

- 60 places left for Phase 2B and Phase 2C
- *In 2022, balloting was conducted at Phase 2A & 2C for Singapore Citizens within 1km.*

WHAT IS MY CHILD INTERESTED IN?

Each school has its niche areas, identity and values. Some may have a focus on a sport or a performing art.

MOTHER TONGUE LANGUAGES

Finding out what Mother Tongue Languages are offered by each school is important.

- Chinese language is offered in all schools.
- Malay Language is offered in all schools except Special Assistance Plan or SAP schools.
- While Tamil Language is offered in most schools, I should confirm this with my preferred school just to be sure.

IS THE SCHOOL NEAR MY HOME?

It would mean shorter traveling time, lower transport costs and more opportunities for me to take part in their activities and to know more about the school.



What should I focus on when preparing my child for P1?

Familiarising your child with primary school environment and routines

- Visit MOE website and primary school website.
- Get elder siblings and cousins to share positive primary school experiences.
- Have a discussion on:
 - School Hours
 - Flag-Raising Ceremony
 - Assembly
 - Recess
 - Taking the School Bus (if relevant)
- Attend P1 Orientation.



What should I focus on when preparing my child for P1?

Exciting your child about primary school

- Purchase the school uniform and shoes together.
- Choose the school bag and stationery together.
- Label the school books and stationery together.



What should I focus on when preparing my child for P1?

Fostering a healthy lifestyle for your child

- Having sufficient sleep daily
- Having a balanced diet
- Drinking water
- Having time for unstructured play
- Participating in outdoor activities in the day



What should I focus on when preparing my child for P1?



Developing your child's independence

- Tying shoe laces
- Dressing himself/herself
- Eating on his/her own
- Packing his/her own bag
- Having good toilet habits
- Having good hygiene habits
- Buying things
- Remembering what needs to be done

What should I focus on when preparing my child for P1?

Practising social skills

- Greeting teachers and school staff
- Being quiet and listen when someone is speaking
- Taking turns during an activity
- Not touching or taking things without permission



What should I focus on when preparing my child for P1?

Practising learning skills



- Listening attentively and actively for longer periods of time.
- Staying on task for longer periods of time.
- Spelling and writing name in the English Language and Mother Tongue Language.
- Understanding simple instructions in the English Language and Mother Tongue Language.
- Responding when name is called.
- Asking for permission and help.
- Passing messages accurately.

What should I focus on when preparing my child for P1?



READ! READ! READ!

- Cultivate a love for reading in your child.
- Read to your child.
- Read with your child.

What should I focus on when preparing my child for P1?



OBSERVE AND DESCRIBE

- Encourage your child to observe the things around him/her (e.g. colours, environment, emotions and activity).
- Get your child to talk about what he/she sees and hears.

What should I focus on when preparing my child for P1?

LEARNING MATHEMATICS ACTIVELY

- Observe mathematics in real life (e.g. numbers and shapes).
- Learn mathematics in real settings (e.g. counting).



DO NOT OVER-PREPARE!

- DO NOT familiarise your child with the official textbook and readers.
- DO NOT overdo the advance preparation.
- This takes away the joy of learning something new together with others in school.
